## Introduction

Colorado Libraries Collaborate (CLC) is a reciprocal borrowing program that allows patrons of member libraries to borrow from other member libraries. The Lone Cone Library District (LCLD) o ers reciprocal borrowing privileges to non-LCLD residents who are cardholders of Colorado Libraries Collaborate (CLC) program participants. ## Rules/Regulations

- Acceptable forms of picture ID: driver's license, passport, school ID, or any other government-issued document showing a photo and borrower's name.
- Acceptable forms of proof of address: driver's license, checkbook, car registration, pay stub (with address), mail with a current postmark, bill, mortgage or lease agreement, or any "o icial" document with borrower's name and current address.
- CLC borrowers will not be charged a non-resident fee when borrowing from a participating CLC library.
- CLC Borrower Responsibilities:
  - It is the CLC borrower's responsibility to be in good standing at his/her home library. Cardholders not in good standing may not be eligible to borrow materials from LCLD.
    CLC borrowers will be informed about LCLD rules and policies.
    CLC borrowers are responsible for understanding and abiding by the rules and policies of LCLD.
    CLC borrowers are responsible for all materials checked out on their cards.
  - O Any materials borrowed by a CLC borrower are subject to LCLD loan policies and due dates.
  - $\bigcirc$  CLC borrowers are allowed access to subscription databases from library computers
